## ENTRY FEES:

**Open/Amateur/Junior/Senior:** \$15 per class make checks payable to NASMA

**Youth** \$12 per class make checks payable to NASMA

**Extreme Trail Challenge** (open to donkeys, mules & horses) \$13 All entries and meet MO health guidelines Coggins required.

**POST ENTRIES: Open/Amateur/Junior/Senior:** \$20 per class. **Youth** \$15 per class make checks payable to NASMA.

**NASMA FEE:** \$2 per mule/donkey/horse not to exceed \$10 per owner.

**STALLS:** \$50 for show (Thursday, Friday, Saturday). 1 animal per stall

**OFFICE/GROUNDS FEE:** \$10 per animal

**CAMPING:** \$20 per night. No overnight tie outs.

**HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** All horses, mules and donkeys are subject to Missouri Law which requires current Coggins test 12 months to date of show. In addition, out of state animals must have a 30-day health certificate for ALL horses, mules and donkeys, except suckling foals. **DRUG TESTING:** All animals entered in a NASMA event are subject to drug test under the direction of the NASMA office or that of the show management of a particular show according to the guidelines in the Sixth Edition of the NASMA Handbook/Rule Book.

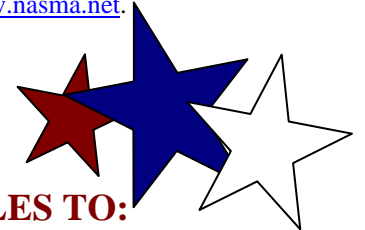

### ★ ALL STAR 2008 PREMIUMS

- Ribbons through Sixth Place in each class.
- Payback: 60% payback with 6 or more entries.
- Awards and pay backs to Futurity
- Classes 40, 43, & 47 must have 10 entries for \$250 payback. Less than 10 entries, 60% payback.

### ★ FUTURITY 2008 PREMIUMS

- Ribbons through Sixth Place in each class.
- **Weanlings:** 80% payouts of jack nomination/foal nomination + \$250. Split between johns and mollies 1st - 6th place
- **Yearlings:** 80% payout of entry fees + \$250 split between johns and mollies. 1st - 6th place payout.
- **Two Year old:** Payback: 80% payout of entry fees + \$250 split between halter and walk/trot. 1st - 6th place payout. Entries do not have to enter both classes for payouts.
- **Three Year Old:** Payback: 80% payout of entry fees + \$375 split between halter, trail and western pleasure. 1st - 6th place payouts. Entries do not have to enter all classes for payouts.
- **Leading Sire:** Plaque
- ★ **AMATEUR CLASSES:** Current NASMA Amateur Card required.
- ★ **JUNIOR MULES** are determined on Jan. 1. Junior Mules are 5 years and younger and must show veterinary mousing certificate or NASMA registration paper at time of entry.

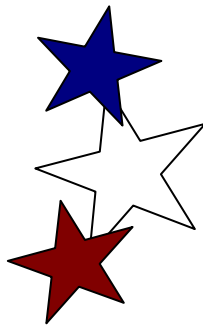

### ★ ★ **YEARLING LONGE LINE RULES**

1. The exhibitors enter the ring one at a time.
2. When the whistle blows, 90 seconds are allowed to walk and jog/trot in both directions.
3. After all exhibitors have lounged their mules, they are stood up, as in a halter class, and judged on conformation suitable to a performance mule.
4. Judges are instructed to judge 70% on way of going suitable to a pleasure mule and 30% on conformation suitable to a pleasure mule.
5. Equipment is a rope halter or flat halter and lounge line attached to the halter by the side ring or center, not to go over the nose, under the chin or over the poll.
6. Exhibitors are to dress appropriately, as if presenting a halter mule in competition. Hunt Seat exhibitors may dress in English attire if entry is thought to be a hunt seat prospect.
